The main lesson learnt is that the readiness of ESL students to pursue their studies in a UK university was questionable, but over time they demonstrated that they had learnt through different forms of interactions in academia. Sociocultural theory is used to explain the changes over time that students reported in their academic reading practices and difficulties. This study viewed reading as a social practice as students improved through their participation in academic activities.

Statement number three deals with students' perceptions on their ability in reading English text. The table 4.3 indicates that there were 10% increase in strongly agree statement and 58% increase in agree statement. Moreover, there was a significant drop on the neutral statement, from 19% to 0%.

Some of the converging reasons that the students in both of the teachers' classes liked ER

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were the intrinsic value of reading (reading is fun and pleasurable, reading provides a relaxing time, and reading an English book is satisfying), autonomy (freedom to choose one's own books), the value of ER books (easiness and fun stories), and the extrinsic utility value of reading (language benefits).

Objective: The purpose of this study was to determine the perceptions of students towards e-learning during the lock down. 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A pair of questionnaires were used to measure students' perceptions and attitudes prior to and after the novel class. Analysis of the pretest and post-test shows that after a semester-long novel-reading process, students demonstrated improvement in attitudes, confidence,

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interest, and their own perceived reading ability.

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THE STUDENTS ' PERCEPTIONS TOWARDS AUTHENTIC MATERIALS FOR ...

For students, the use of open textbooks instead of copyright-restricted texts appears to result in more positive student perceptions towards reading and learning. Students indicated the ability to write in the hard-copy text, or to access online videos that support the reading, makes the learning process more comfortable and the concepts more approachable.

Secondary Students ' Perceptions of Open Science Textbooks

The majority of the students indicated that they liked the implementation of PBL in the Critical Reading class. 42.9% of the students showed neutral response, another 42.9% of the students like PBL, and 14.3% of the students highly like Project-Based Learning in Critical Reading Class.

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
